Easter Sunday Here I Stand—Standing in Victory April 16, 2017

A warm welcome to those who are visiting us today. You may hang your coat in the entry way of the church or on the coat rack downstairs. The bathrooms are located in the basement of this building. <u>As We Gather:</u> Easters come and go, and it seems that little changes. Or does it? What we sing and celebrate today is already ours. We were baptized into His death and raised with Christ to new and everlasting life. *Easter is the celebration not only of Christ's victory but also of our own victory in Christ Jesus, our Savior.* Christ is risen, and we with Him. It is a victory already ours but not yet fully complete in us. Part of Christian life is seeing who we are and the life we live in the context of the baptismal miracle of new identity and new life that we have been given. Every day we grasp this gift by faith and remember it is "for me." We wear a new name and are heirs of an eternal victory and a life that death cannot overcome. How might our lives change if we lived out this glorious Easter truth more than one day a year?

The Prayer of the Day

P: The Lord be with you.

C: And also with you.

P: Let us pray.

C: Amen. (spoken)

Risen Lord, on this day we praise You and give thanks for the living hope that is ours through faith in Your name. You suffered and died, taking onto Yourself the penalty that we deserved for our sins. You were buried in a borrowed tomb and on the third day You rose in victory, defeating sin, death and the devil. Your victory is our victory, and today, as we stand at the empty tomb, we rejoice in the gift of life and resurrection that You have won for us. Mighty Savior, hear our prayer and accept our thanks and praise.

<u>The First Lesson:</u> **Hosea 6:1-3** (The restoration granted on the third day means God's people can forever walk in God presence, having as our own the victory Jesus won over death.)

"Come, let us return to the LORD.

He has torn us to pieces
but He will heal us;

He has injured us
but He will bind up our wounds.

² After two days He will revive us;
on the third day He will restore us,
that we may live in His presence.

³ Let us acknowledge the LORD;

Sunday School and Preschool Selection: "Up From the Grave He Arose"

<u>The Second Lesson:</u> 1 Corinthians 15:20-28 (The firstfruit of the harvest guarantees more to come. Christ's victory over death serves as a guarantee of your ultimate victory over death.)

²⁰ But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. ²¹ For since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead comes also through a Man. ²² For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive. ²³ But each in turn: Christ, the firstfruits; then, when He comes, those who belong to Him. ²⁴ Then the end will come, when He hands over the kingdom to God the Father after He has destroyed all dominion, authority and power. ²⁵ For He must reign until He has put all His enemies under His feet. ²⁶ The last enemy to be destroyed is death. ²⁷ For He "has put everything under His feet." Now when it says that "everything" has been put under Him, it is clear that this does not include God Himself, who put everything under Christ. ²⁸ When He has done this, then the Son Himself will be made subject to Him who put everything under Him, so that God may be all in all.

<u>Verse of the Day:</u> (Sung by the soloist with flute descant) Alleluia. Alleluia. Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia. This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it. Alleluia. (Psalm 118:24)

<u>The Gospel Lesson:</u> Luke 24:1-9 (The ultimate victory.)

¹On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, the women took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. ² They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, ³ but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. ⁴ While they were wondering about this, suddenly two men in clothes that gleamed like lightning stood beside them. ⁵ In their fright the women bowed down with their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? ⁶ He is not here; He has risen! Remember how He told you, while He was still with you in Galilee: ⁷ 'The Son of Man must be delivered over to the hands of sinners, be crucified and on the third day be raised again.' "⁸ Then they remembered His words.

<u>Catechism</u>--Second Article of the Apostles' Creed & 1 Corinthians 15:17

P: Paul writes, "If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins." Because of this, Easter morning delivers the joyous truth that Christ has been raised, and God has made us His people through our Baptism into Christ. Living together in trust and hope, we confess our faith in His work accomplished for us.

P: Let us share together our hope in the resurrection with these words from the Apostle's Creed:

C: I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. *The third day He rose again from the dead*. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty. From there He will come to judge the living and the dead.

P: What does this mean for us?

C: I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the Virgin Mary, is my Lord. He has redeemed me, a lost and condemned creature, purchased and won me from all sins, from death and from the power of the devil, not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death.

All this He did that I should be His own, and live under Him in His kingdom, and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence and blessedness, just as He has risen from death and lives and rules eternally.

This is most certainly true.
