Last Sunday after the Epiphany— The Transfiguration of our Lord February 11, 2024

A warm welcome to those who are visiting us today. You may hang your coat in the entry way of the church or on the coat rack downstairs. The bathrooms are located in the lower level of this building. We thank You this day for coming down the mountain, leaving behind the brilliant display of Your glory, and resolutely moving forward to Calvary's cross. We eagerly await the day when we will see Your glory with our fellow believers in heaven. Amen.

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Today's Theme: A GLIMPSE OF HIS TRUE GLORY

We began Epiphany season at the Jordan River. At His baptism, Jesus heard His Father's glorious voice: "You are My Son, whom I love" (Mark 1:11). From that day, in word and deed, Jesus began to reveal more about Himself. He demonstrated the extent of His authority and power and love. Along the way, we had an epiphany. Jesus has to be the very Son of God! Yet, Jesus looked so normal, like an ordinary carpenter or your average rabbi or just another prophet. Until today. We have traveled from the river to the mountain. Today, on the Mount of Transfiguration, Jesus gives us a glimpse of His true glory. As we see Him in His dazzling brilliance, the Father speaks again, this time to us: "This is My Son, whom I love. Listen to Him!"

This final epiphany prepares us for the journey of Lent where we will witness the most glorious work that Jesus would do when He came down from this mountain.

Pastor's Welcome

Invocation

Pastor: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Congregation: Amen.

Opening Sentences Isaiah 30:15, 18, 29

- P: This is what the Sovereign LORD, the Holy One of Israel, says:
- C: "In repentance and rest is your salvation, in quietness and trust is your strength,
- P: Yet the LORD longs to be gracious to you; therefore He will rise up to show you compassion.
- C: For the LORD is a God of justice. Blessed are all who wait for Him!
- P: And you will sing as on the night you celebrate a holy festival;
- C: your hearts will rejoice as when people playing pipes go up to the mountain of the LORD, to the Rock of Israel.

Confession and Absolution

- P: O God, our Father, we admit and confess that we are by nature sinful and unclean and that we have sinned against You in thought, word, and deed.
- C: Have mercy on us, and forgive us, O Lord.
- P: We confess that we have not always brought glory to You through our words and our deeds.
- C: Have mercy on us, and forgive us, O Lord.
- P: We repent of all that is sinful in our lives, both that which we know and those things unknown to us that are against Your righteous laws.
- C: Have mercy on us, and forgive us, O Lord.

Pastor: Refrain






<u>Verse 1</u>: God of all creation, earth and sea and sky, God of all eternity: hear us, hear us. **Refrain**

Verse 2: God of ev'ry nation, God of all who live, God of meek and lowly ones: hear us, hear us. **Refrain**


Verse 3: God of our salvation, God of grace and peace, God of wisdom and of love: hear us, hear us. **Refrain**

- P: Upon this your confession and by the command of our Lord, I, a called and ordained servant of Christ, forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.
- P: Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you completely, and may your whole spirit, soul, and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. He who calls you is faithful; He will surely do it.
- C: Amen.

O Lord, our God, You shone Your love to us through Your Son and in His light is our hope and joy. Take us up to the mountain of His brightness that when we descend in the valleys of our lives, His light may remain upon us to guide our way. Grant that we may receive the testimony of Moses and Elijah fulfilled in Christ and make known Christ's light to the world; through Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

The Word of God


First Lesson 2 CORINTHIANS 4:3-6 We cannot yet physically see what those disciples saw on the Mount of Transfiguration. But St. Paul teaches we can still see the glory of Christ's light in the gospel.

³ And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing. ⁴ The god of this age has blinded the minds of unbelievers, so that they cannot see the light of the gospel that displays the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. ⁵ For what we preach is not ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, and ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake. ⁶ For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," made His light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of God's glory displayed in the face of Christ. (NIV 2011)

P: The Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God.

Gospel Acclamation (Pastor sings the verses; Congregation sings the "Alleluia! Alleluia! Praise the Word of truth and life!")



Gospel MARK 9:2-9 Jesus gives Peter, James, and John a glimpse of His true glory.

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the ninth chapter.

C: Glory to You, O Lord.

² After six days Jesus took Peter, James and John with Him and led them up a high mountain, where they were all alone. There He was transfigured before them. ³ His clothes became dazzling white, whiter than anyone in the world could bleach them. ⁴ And there appeared before them Elijah and Moses, who were talking with Jesus.

⁵ Peter said to Jesus, "Rabbi, it is good for us to be here. Let us put up three shelters—one for You, one for Moses and one for Elijah." ⁶ (He did not know what to say, they were so frightened.)

⁷ Then a cloud appeared and covered them, and a voice came from the cloud: "This is My Son, whom I love. Listen to Him!"

⁸ Suddenly, when they looked around, they no longer saw anyone with them except Jesus.

 9 As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus gave them orders not to tell anyone what they had seen until the Son of Man had risen from the dead. (NIV 2011)

Sermon

The Second Article of the Athanasian Creed (Confessed in unison)

It is furthermore necessary for eternal salvation truly to believe that our Lord Jesus Christ also took on human flesh.

Now this is the true Christian faith: We believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, God's Son, is both God and man. He is God, eternally begotten from the nature of the Father, and He is man, born in time from the nature of His mother, fully God, fully man, with rational soul and human flesh, equal to the Father as to His deity, less than the Father as to His humanity; and though He is both God and Man, Christ is not two persons but one, one, not by changing the deity into flesh, but by taking the humanity into God; one, indeed, not by mixture of the natures, but by unity in one person; for just as the rational soul and flesh are one human being, so God and man are one Christ. He suffered for our salvation, descended into hell, rose the third day from the dead. He ascended into heaven, is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty, and from there He will come to judge the living and the dead. At His coming all people will rise with their own bodies to answer for their personal deeds. Those who have done good will enter eternal life, but those who have done evil will go into eternal fire.

This is the true Christian faith. Whoever does not faithfully and firmly believe this cannot be saved.

Holy, Holy, Holy




Words of Institution

Farewell to Alleluia

P: Brothers and sisters in Christ, when we next gather for worship, it will be Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent. On that day we will begin our solemn journey to the Savior's cross. While the joy of faith remains undiminished throughout the year, our rejoicing during Lent is muted and quiet. For centuries, therefore, the Christian churches have omitted their most jubilant songs during this season, including the word *alleluia*, which means, "praise the Lord."

Now for a time we say farewell to *alleluia*. We do this to prepare ourselves for the quieter days of Lent. The *alleluias* will return on Easter morning as we gather to shout our praise to the risen Lord.

HAPPY VALENTINE'S DAY

On February 14, we commemorate Valentine, Martyr. The word "martyr" reminds us that Valentine died for confessing his faith in Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior. For eighteen hundred years, Valentine's faithful witness has inspired Christian people to faith-filled words and loving deeds. A physician and priest in Rome during the rule of Emperor Claudius, Valentine lived in a time when Christians were harshly persecuted because of their religion. Arrested by Roman authorities, he received a death sentence. Tradition suggests that while Valentine was waiting in prison for his day of execution, he developed a friendship with the young daughter of his jailer. He told the girl about Jesus and shared his hope of heaven. On the day of his execution, he left her a note cut into a special shape. Written inside was a message of affection and encouragement. He signed the letter "your Valentine," beginning a tradition that has changed and grown through the centuries. Love for Christ and love in Christ shaped the actions of Valentine. On Valentine's Day, it is good to reflect on what that love is like.
